

CORONAVIRUS (COVID – 19)

Dear Customers and staff,

There is understandable concern about COVID-19 in our communities right now and we would like you to know McCart Pharmacy is doing everything possible to help keep our staff and customers safe and healthy during this time. Your health and your family's health are paramount to us.

We have remained in close contact with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and other federal and state agencies to monitor developments and updated guidance on coronavirus (COVID-19)

We are ordering and receiving new shipments of supplies please know we are working to re-stock and you will see more products on the shelves as soon as the inventory is available. You are welcome to call us ahead of visiting our store, to see if the items you are looking for are currently available.

Priority for all of us right now needs to be constant hand washing, staying home if we are feeling sick, and if we do get sick, self-isolating at home to not spread the risk of the virus.
